THINGS TO DO / ACTIVITÉS À FAIRE

Downtown Toronto

1. **The CN Tower:** Towering over the city at 1,815 ft, the CN Tower is Toronto's landmark attraction and is famous for offering unparalleled views of the city. Timed Admission \$43 plus tax/Person.

2. **Ripley's Aquarium of Canada is beside the CN Tower:** Among the 16,000 marine animals at Ripley's Aquarium of Canada live 12 impressive sharks. Timed Admission \$44 plus tax/person.

3. **Toronto Blue Jays at Roger's Centre:** Taking in a Major League Baseball game in the stadium beside the CN tower is a great evening out. Lots of food vendors inside the ball park. Ask a local for information on the rules and (most importantly) which team you should be cheering for (Go Blue Jays!). Last regular game is Oct 1 but hopefully playoff games will be underway during the tournament.
4. **The Distillery Historic District:** The pedestrian-only Distillery District, set in quaint 19th century buildings that once housed a large whiskey distillery, draws crowds to its cobblestone streets lined with hip indie restaurants, bars and boutiques. It is a popular spot to spend the afternoon and is within walking distance of Union Station in downtown Toronto.
5. **St. Lawrence Market** was Toronto's first public market and not far from the Distillery District: Originally called Market Square, St. Lawrence Market's inception was due to an increase in York's (Toronto's) population. Nearly 200 years later, St. Lawrence Market thrives as a culinary hub where foodies gather for local and artisanal eats.
6. **The Hockey Hall of Fame** is across the street from Union Train Station: A limited number of free Admission Passes, courtesy of Pepsi Canada, are available at the Player Services Desk. Looking to brush up on your ice hockey skills? Face virtual versions of hockey legends Carey Price and Frederik Anderson (FYI famous goalies) to practice your slapshot with a real puck and stick, inside of an immersive rink as the virtual goalies protect their nets. General admission \$25 plus Tax/person. Check hours as they usually close at 5PM.

Outside the Greater Toronto Area (GTA)

7. **Niagara Falls:** Over 110K away from the hotel and travel time may vary but expect 3+ hours each way. It is truly a breathtaking natural wonder but very crowded on weekends.
